Call To Worship Pastor Ken

Leader: Friends, as we draw close to Christmas, what are we waiting for now?

People: We are waiting for love — love that shows up when we are unsure, love that meets us in the ordinary and the unexpected.

Leader: The prophet speaks of a sign, a promise from God, given not to the confident, but to the fearful.

People: We listen for God's love, a love that does not abandon us, a love that comes to be with us.

Leader: In Matthew's gospel, we hear of Joseph — a man faced with a hard choice, who listens, trusts, and acts in love.

People: We give thanks for a love that is patient and courageous, a love that chooses faithfulness over fear.

Leader: Today we light the candle of love, remembering that God's love takes on flesh and name.

People: Emmanuel — God with us — love born into our world, love strong enough to change us.

Leader: Come, let us worship the God who comes near.

All: We come to worship, ready to receive and to share the love that has first been given to us.

<u>Call to Confession</u> Pastor Ken

Friends, Advent reminds us that God comes to us in love—not because we have everything figured out, but because we often do not. We admit we sometimes resist this love, hesitating to trust and letting fear or self-protection guide us. When love calls for courage or compassion, we may turn away. Yet, God meets us with mercy, promising to be with us even now. Trusting in that grace, let us confess together and open our hearts to the love that heals and restores.

Unison Prayer of Confession

All: Loving God, we confess that we do not always trust your promises. When love asks us to be brave, we hesitate. When love calls us to welcome the unexpected, we resist.

We admit that fear too often guides our decisions, and convenience shapes our compassion. We turn inward instead of toward our neighbors, and we close our hearts when you call us to open them.

Forgive us, O God. Remind us that you are with us — in uncertainty, in change, and in hope.

Restore us by your grace, so that we may receive your love anew and share that love freely with the world. Amen.

Leader: Let us take a moment for silent confession and personal reflection.

Assurance of Pardon

Leader: Hear the good news! The love of God does not hesitate or hold back. In Jesus Christ, God comes to be *with us*, not to condemn us, but to save us. The promises spoken by the prophets are fulfilled, and grace is given before we even ask. In Christ, we are forgiven, made new, and invited to begin again. Friends, believe this good news: In Jesus Christ, we are forgiven and loved.

ALL: Thanks be to God! Amen.
